Reports no gender pay gap

Women make up 27% of higher-paid jobs and 27.6% of lower-paid jobs

This company is one of 8% of companies that doesn't report a pay gap

2017 GENDER PAY GAP

This is Wren Kitchens gender pay gap report at the 'snapshot' date of 5 April 2017

The mean average pay of men was 3.3% higher than the mean average of women

We had no gap in the median pay between men and women

The mean average bonus awarded to men was 22.3% higher than the mean average for women

The median gap between bonuses paid for men and women was 19.6%

6.3% more women were awarded a bonus

Women represent 27.6% of lower paid jobs and 27.0% of higher paid jobs

Our gender distribution was 70.4% men and 29.6% women
